All have been charged, and will face trial on 7<sup>th</sup> February 2008. Penal Code Section 295 states that “whoever destroys, damages or defiles any place of worship..with the intention of thereby insulting the religion..shall be punished with imprisonment for a term which may extend to two years or with fine, or

both”, whilst Section 295A incorporates malicious acts intended to offend the religious beliefs of others. Under Section 505 (b) individuals are subject to two years imprisonment on the basis of the “intent to cause..fear or alarm to the public..whereby any person may be induced to commit an offence against the State.”

Section 5 of the Emergency Provisions Act includes the intent to “spread false news, knowing or having reason to believe that it is not true” and “to alarm the people..in a way that would create panic amongst them”. Meanwhile, the Arms Act accounts for the manufacture, sale and possession of arms, whereby a three year imprisonment may be given for the “importation or exportation of any arms, ammunition or military stores”.

The AHRC has also received incomplete lists of twelve monks who have either disappeared or have deceased, ten students who have been dismissed from Sathana University and fifteen monks who are outside the country. Furthermore, the AHRC has received a list of fifty-seven monasteries that have been searched and destroyed by the authorities, and two that were forced to close.
